Izzie's fundraising for the Little Princess Trust



Local girl Izzie Rimmer has been growing her hair for the last two years with the sole purpose of donating it to the Little Princess Trust. The Little Princess Trust provides real hair wigs free of charge to children and young people up to the age of 24 who have sadly lost their own hair due to cancer treatment and other illnesses.

Izzie's Dad Allan said: "When she was six, she saw a programme about wigs being made for children who have lost their hair and since then she's been determined to grow her hair long enough to donate it to be made into a wig. Her hair was finally long enough to be cut on 24th April by local hairdresser and friend, Sarah Irvine. As well as donating her hair Izzie wanted to raise some much-needed funds for these wigs to be made. Each wig costs approximately £550 to make, so every penny is important.

"Izzie commenced her fundraising efforts with a modest target of £200. With the help of friends and family she has now raised over £1,000, enough for two whole wigs. We're all immensely proud of her."

The Trust relies solely on the efforts of enthusiastic community fundraisers and they receive no formal funding, so Izzie's efforts will be very welcome.

The Family Fun Day event was organised by the local community to support Heswall Disabled Children's Holiday Fund and included junior football matches, a bouncy castle, barbeque, live music, games and a raffle. Sam attended to take part in the medal presentation ceremony and the children had the opportunity to ask her questions about her sporting career.

Vinny Keating, Chairman and Registered Manager of the Heswall Disabled Children's Holiday Fund, said: "It was a brilliant day supported by Glenavon, Mersey Royal and Runcorn Linnetts girls teams. The girls playing and their parents have been incredibly generous with their time and money and helped to raise £960.

"Thanks also to Rob Seabury, manager of JD Wetherspoon in West Kirby and Arlene Sinclair who owns The Therapy Suite in Heswall. They created the event together and put the hours in and the Heswall Disabled Children's Holiday Fund is incredibly grateful.

The Heswall Disabled Children's Holiday Fund has been providing free holidays for disabled children since the 1960s. It has now developed into an Ofsted Outstanding holiday scheme provider, hiring The Barnstondale Activity Centre in the heart of Wirral. The charity needs to raise £30,000 to run the camp and ensure it remains free of charge to all children who need their support.

In addition to being accredited as Outstanding by Ofsted for the care and activities enjoyed by the children, the charity was also awarded The Queens Award for Voluntary Service in 2017. This was in recognition of the positive impact the charity has had on the lives of its volunteers, who work hard, not only on the holiday camp, but also planning and fundraising to make the charity a success.
