Irby Village 1889



Thanks to Mark Kinnish for sending us this photograph of Irby Village taken in 1889.

Mark told *Heswall Magazine*: "At the time Thingwall Road was no more than just a dirt track. In the distance you can see a building which was known as the Prince of Wales Pub which was built during the 1800s. It was only licensed as a beer house unlike the other pub in the village The Anchor which was fully licensed.

"The Prince of Wales lost its licence around 1920 when the Peers family ran it. During the Second World War the building was used as the headquarters of the Home Guard and was later demolished. The site today of the pub is next to the shops by the free car park in Irby Village. The nearest buildings used to be the old cottages but these are long gone."


